

What Is The RMAC?



The Rocky Mount Area Youth Council is a state

chartered organization which is composed of area high school students. It is designed to serve, listen to and represent local youth in all matters of civic interest and need.

Purpose

- To provide an organization of young people which can carry on projects for the benefit of the entire area. The object is not to compete with existing groups, but to provide services by a central planning body.

- To provide an opportunity for young people to share in local government matters and to learn to become more responsible citizens.
- To initiate programs and projects that are of benefit to the youth and the community.
- To encourage city planning agencies to invite young people to serve on city committees and contribute to community planning.

Goals

- To work with existing youth programs and groups to create better total youth programming in the Rocky Mount area.
- To serve as a line of communication between youth and adults.



- To serve as an advisory committee on youth affairs to local government.
- To initiate, organize and supervise programs and projects of all types, which will benefit youth.
